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Europe faces being crippled by debt until 2021, with devastating consequences for its population of 500million people, including those in Britain, Angela Merkel warned yesterday.

The German Chancellor's gloomy forecast of ten years of economic misery followed the failure at the G20 summit in Cannes to agree how to ball out bankrupt Greece.

'This debt crisis will not simply go away,' Mrs Merkel said. 'It will certainly be a decade before we are in a better position.'

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Gartner Survey Highlights Consumer Fatigue with Social Media

Analysts to Explore Social Media Landscape at the Gartner Portals, Content & Collaboration Summit 2011, September 21-22, London

There are signs of maturity in the social media market, as some users in certain segments are showing "social media fatigue", according to a survey by Gartner, Inc. The survey reveals continued localization of usage, whereby certain country-specific social characteristics dictate preferences. However, large global brands such as Facebook are making headway in countries where they have not historically been strong.

Gartner surveyed 6,295 respondents, between the ages of 13 and 74, in 11 developed and developing markets in December 2010 and January 2011. Consumers were asked about their use of and opinions about social media sites with the aim of examining usage trends and how enthusiastic users were about social media in general across a range of countries.

"Overall, our survey underlined respondents' continued enthusiasm for social media," said Charlotte Patrick, principal research analyst at Gartner. "Teenagers and those in their twenties were significantly more likely to say that they had increased their usage, while at the other end of the 'enthusiasm spectrum', the age-related differences were much less marked, with fairly consistent percentages saying that they were using social media less."

Report: Tablet Sales to Cut Magazine Paper Use 20 Percent by 2015

Tablet sales to reach 195 million by '15, per RISI.



Even paper-focused companies are predicting a major fall for the printed page in the coming years.

According to a <u>study</u> from forest products industry information provider <u>RISI</u>, tablets will have a serious effect on use of paper products in the near future. With over 10 million tablets currently in use in North America alone, RISI says that by 2015 paper end uses (including magazine, book and newspaper) will drop 12-21 percent from 2010 numbers.

Over the next 15 years, paper usage will decrease more rapidly, with numbers dropping another 40-50 percent.



Of course you don't. Those documents are tens, sometimes hundreds, of pages long. You sign away even your most basic of rights. They're in legalise. Even if you could read them, it would take you all day! And you'd have to spend countless more hours just trying to understand the lawyer-talk in them!. And yet, they are REALLY important! Should any discrepancy between yourself and the other party be brought into a court of law, they will could potentially have a HUGE effect (monetary, or otherwise) on your life!

What if, instead of just blindly agreeing to a TOS document you haven't read, you could just amend the TOS right there on the spot? Right there on the sign-up form.

Did you know that, when you're signing a legal contract in the United States, you have the right to strikeout any clause that you do not understand or do not agree to? [source] With the TOSAmend bookmarklet, you can also easily do this with web-based contracts and terms of services.

Implantable sensor tracks cancer in the body


It looks like a tiny white breath mint. "With this, we are going to bring the laboratory into the patient," says Michael Cima at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. The little capsule is in fact an innovative tool in the battle against cancer that can track the growth of a tumour without repeated invasive procedures.

It is small enough to fit inside a needle and implant in the body during a biopsy. Magnetic nanoparticles fill the capsule's hollow interior, each sporting a few monoclonal antibodies. These are proteins engineered to bind to molecules of interest, such as human chorionic gonadotrophin (hCG), a hormone that tumour cells overproduce in testicular and ovarian cancers.

A semi-permeable membrane allows molecules to flow into the capsule, but prevents the nanoparticles from drifting out. To read the device and evaluate whether a nearby tumour is receding or growing, doctors need only use an MRI scan to detect clusters of cancer-related molecules within the device.

Cima's team tested the device in mice injected with human cancer cells. An MRI showed that the resulting tumours were increasing in size.

India: The next university superpower?

India has ambitious plans to increase graduate numbers in a way which would give it the size and status of an education superpower.

The figures are staggering. India's government speaks of increasing the proportion of young people going to university from 12% at present to 30% by 2025 - approaching the levels of many Western countries.

It wants to expand its university system to meet the aspirations of a growing middle class, to widen access, and become a "knowledge powerhouse".

It will mean increasing the country's student population from 12 million to over 30 million, and will put it on course to becoming one of the world's largest education systems.

"We will very likely be number two if not number one in terms of numbers," says Pawan Agarwal, a former civil servant and author of Indian Higher Education: Envisioning the Future.





Cops on the trail of crimes that haven't happened

THE patrol car comes to a stop in a sleepy neighbourhood of small, earthcoloured homes. A woman saunters past pushing a stroller. It is daytime in the artsy beach town of Santa Cruz but I am still a little spooked. Futuristic crime prediction software sent me here with my companion, deputy chief of police Steve Clark. And it's just possible that the tranquillity is due to our presence.

Rather than predicting who will commit crimes, like the fictitious "precrime" system from the 2002 film *Minority Report*, the software that the Santa Cruz police department has recently started field-testing looks at where crime might be committed.

It uses the locations of past incidents to flag up likely future crime scenes. Police can then target their patrols on these areas, in the hope that their presence might stop the predicted crimes from happening at all. At the very least, they will be on the spot to help victims and make arrests.

The program has been built by mathematician George Mohler, at Santa Clara University in California, and his colleagues. They noted that some crimes follow potentially predictable patterns. One burglary, for example, tends to trigger others nearby in the next few days, rather like aftershocks from an earthquake (see graph). In 2010, Mohler's team turned equations used to predict aftershocks into the basis for a program that uses the dates and times of reported crimes to predict when and where the "aftercrimes" will occur.



Get into the office, sit down at the computer and lay your cellphone on the desk – a ritual that millions play out every morning, but one that could reveal more than you expect. Security researchers have discovered they can detect the vibrations caused by using a computer keyboard and read off what is being typed simply by placing a smartphone with a keylogging app on the desk nearby.

Patrick Traynor and colleagues at the Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta were able to use the motion sensors inside an iPhone to read keystrokes from a keyboard 5 centimetres away with up to 80 per cent accuracy.

The sensors don't recognise the vibrations of particular individual keys, but for consecutive pairs of keystrokes they can tell whether the keys are on the left or right of the keyboard and how close together they are. This information is then matched to a dictionary to recreate the typed word. For example, the word "canoe" breaks down into four pairs: "CA", "AN", "NO" and "OE". The first pair is classified as left-left-near, the second is left-right-far, and so on.

Thought-controlled computers may soon be a reality

Today's human-computer interface is an I/O bottleneck that can be corrected, says scientist

Computerworld - CAMBRIDGE, Mass. - In 1960, computer scientist J.C.R. Licklider published *Man-Computer Symbiosis*, a paper that outlined his dream for interactive computing and helped pave the way to the creation of the graphical user interface.

This week, at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's Emerging Technology Conference here, another scientist suggested that there may soon come a time when people no longer have to touch a keyboard or a mouse, or even speak a command, in order to perform a computer function.

Instead, said Gerwin Schalk, a research scientist at the Wadsworth Center, a public health laboratory run by the New York state government, a person can think of a command and the computer will respond.



Body organs can send status updates to your cellphone

For cardiac patients such as myself, too much excitement can be a shocking experience. If my heart rate gets too high the implanted defibrillator in my chest can think I'm having a heart attack and give me a friendly remedial shock. But such nasty surprises could soon become less of a concern for people like me – by giving our hearts their very own IP addresses.

Dutch research organisation IMEC, based in Eindhoven, this week demonstrated a new type of wireless body area network (BAN). Dubbed the Human++ BAN platform, the system converts IMEC's ultra-low-power electrocardiogram sensors into wireless nodes in a short-range network, transmitting physiological data to a hub – the patient's cellphone. From there, the readings can be forwarded to doctors via a Wi-Fi or 3G connection. They can also be displayed on the phone or sound an alarm when things are about to go wrong, giving patients like me a chance to try to slow our heart rates and avoid an unnecessary shock.

Julien Penders, who developed the system, says it can also work with other low-power medical sensors, such as electroencephalograms (EEGs) to monitor neurological conditions or electromyograms to detect neuromuscular diseases. Besides helping those already diagnosed with chronic conditions, BANs could be used by people at risk of developing medical problems – the so-called "worried well" – or by fitness enthusiasts and athletes who want to keep tabs on their physiological processes during training.

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

Television broadcasts and other recordings could be compiled and converted using programs developed by the Fraunhofer Institute for Intelligent Analysis. As more people spend more time under the lenses of cameras and in the presence of microphones, and as more footage from those devices goes online, a spoken word crawler with semantic-search capability could allow someone with a smart phone to look up any recorded conversation between two people that's occurred anywhere a microphone was present as easily as any update posted to Facebook. But don't worry. Because communications technologies make it easy to blurt out words you immediately regret, computer scientists at the University of Washington have created a way to put expiration dates on e-mail, chat messages, and Facebook postings. The system, dubbed Vanish, encrypts messages and spreads the data among different computers on file-sharing networks. As turnover occurs in the network, users take their portion of the encrypted key with them, rendering the message undecipherable.

Peer-to-Peer Health Care

Summary of Findings

The internet gives patients and caregivers access not only to information, but also to each other.

Many Americans turn to friends and family for support and advice when they have a health problem. This report shows how people's networks are expanding to include online peers. particularly in the crucible of rare disease. Health professionals remain the central source of information for most Americans, but "peer-to-peer healthcare" is a significant supplement.

This report is based in part on a national telephone survey of 3,001 adults that provides an estimate of how widespread this activity is in the U.S. All numerical data included in the report are based on the telephone survey. The other part of the analysis is based on an online survey of 2,156 members of the National Organization for Rare Disorders (NORD) who wrote short essays about their use of the internet in caring for themselves or for their loved ones.


